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Caldwell Collins leads the Firm's Managed Care Litigation team.

She also defends commercial business owners against premises liability claims; defective product claims; defective drug and medical device claims; and in complex contract disputes.

She also leads the BW Office Leader Committee and serves as the BW office leader for the Nashville office.
