As a registered patent attorney, Ms. Speed focuses her practice on patent disputes, and she represents clients in patent litigation in federal courts throughout the United States, as well as before the Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit, the Patent Trial and Appeal Board, and the International Trade Commission.

Ms. Speed has experience in a wide range of industries and technologies, including medical, dental, chemical, aircraft, defense, electronics, software, telecommunications, motor vehicles, manufacturing, manufactured goods, packaging and containers, tools, machinery, equipment, construction, consumer goods, personal health care products, fans, food and beverages, banking, hunting gear and apparel, farming and agricultural machinery and equipment, utilities, and municipal water and waste treatment.

In addition to the time she spends in the courtroom, Ms. Speed's practice includes negotiating royalties; patent licenses and patent assignments; analyzing freedom to operate; leading design-around efforts; and developing strategies to anticipate and avoid litigation.

- Provides ongoing guidance and strategic counsel regarding patent freedom to operate and patent design-around for all new product development at publicly traded company.
- Successfully defended a publicly traded company in federal court in Delaware against allegations of infringement of eight patents directed to panels that exhibit certain vapor characteristics, systems that include those panels, and methods of manufacturing those panels. Invalidated seven of the eight patents at claim construction, and the plaintiff settled the case regarding the remaining patent.
- Successfully defended a chemical company in federal court in Tennessee against allegations of infringement of three patents directed to certain chemical compositions, methods of making those chemical compositions, and products that incorporate those chemical compositions. Obtained dismissal with prejudice of all claims.
- Successfully defended a company against two separate cases in federal court in Virginia against allegations of infringement of patent directed to methods used in certain medical and biological testing. Obtained dismissal of both cases.
- Successfully opposed a Freedom of Information Law (FOIL) request to the New York State Department of Health concerning the processing and analysis of samples to extract DNA.
