He has handled several arbitration matters and has served as lead trial counsel in multiple state and federal bench and jury trials. At the appellate level, David has handled cases in the Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Eleventh, D.C., and Federal Circuits, as well as before the United States Supreme Court.
